Wednesday, Jan. 7 at 2:30 p.m.—VICTORIA AMORY

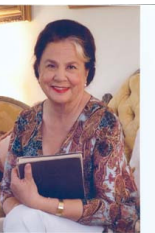

A life-size sculpture of President Roosevelt and Sir Winston Churchill by Holofcener graces the Philip Hultar Sculpture Garden of the Society of the Four Arts in Palm Beach. He will talk on *The Silent Partner, The Creative Side of the Brain* wherein he seeks to explain his late-blooming artistic achievements.

Thursday, January 29 at 6 p.m. DR. CHRISTOS PAPTAEODOROU



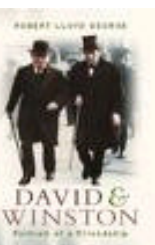

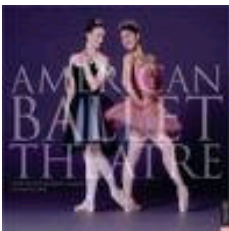

Thursday, March 19 at 6 p.m. - MIKE KARSEN

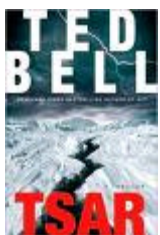
